While the pandemic brought many shifts in the delivery of our services, we remain grateful for all of the lessons learned that will carry forward as part of our regular operations. This includes offering virtual webinars, which will continue alongside in-person events, the online estore of resource materials, organizational support visits over Zoom when needed, and also the increased need for resource deliveries due to staffing challenges. We understand that we will need to continue to meet the needs of Administrators and Educators in different and unique ways over the coming year, as the early learning sector transitions into a new norm.

During 2021 and into the early part of 2022 the ECCDC continued to receive many government supports which we are most grateful for, including from our primary funder Niagara Region Children's Services, alongside various federal and provincial grants. These subsidies supported organizational expenses, advanced ECCDC's technology capacity, supported no cost or low-cost professional learning opportunities, and enabled us to offer free memberships for local early learning programs. We sincerely appreciated having the ongoing support of Niagara Region Children's Services as we navigated new waters.

We extend deepest gratitude to Mountainview Properties for sponsoring the relocation of our office space and conference room to 3550 Schmon Parkway in Thorold at no cost to the organization. This relocation has enabled us to expand the ways in which we service administrators and educators including the availability of unique spaces for onsite planning, team building, and large events. While the construction and move took place in late 2020, we only began realizing all of the benefits in 2021.

In late 2021 and into 2022 we were so appreciative to once again partner with our longstanding supporter The Kiwanis Clubs of Niagara. Our local Kiwanis Club members work tirelessly to fundraise and engage in ongoing planning to assess the needs of Niagara's early learning programs and investigate solutions for supporting needs. In 2021 the Kiwanis Clubs collectively funded an infant and toddler Treasure Baskets project, which benefited over 170 child care programs and saw over \$30,000 invested in pedagogy materials and training to support our local child care sector. Additionally, at the end of our fiscal year in March 2022 the Kiwanis Clubs of Niagara gifted ECCDC with a four-year financial commitment for a van lease to increase our capacity for resource deliveries and onsite community outreach across Niagara Region. March 2022 brought new partnerships with Roots of Empathy as we embarked on trialling Seeds of Empathy in five early learning programs and with Niagara College to develop and implement an accelerated Early Childhood Education Diploma Program. We feel so fortunate to have established both of these outstanding new partnerships and we are excited to see how these programs shift and change over the coming year.

Most of all we are grateful to all of you: our members, community partners, and stakeholders, for continuing to work alongside our Team at the ECCDC on many initiatives and for providing ongoing feedback on how we may shift our services in new and unique ways. We couldn't do this work without you, and we feel privileged every day to be able to do so.

Thank you for being an exceptional group of educators, community planning partners and stakeholders. Thank you for caring so much about children and families and ensuring that they have the best possible opportunities to grow and develop. We appreciate all that you are, all that you do and all that you bring to the lives of children and families each and every day.





Supporting Niagara's Early Learning Programs with Greater Access to Curriculum Resources, Classroom Equipment, and Organizational Supports through a Community Outreach Van

The Early Childhood Community Development (ECCDC) was grateful to be the recipient of a four-year financial commitment of close to \$50,000 from the Kiwanis Clubs of Niagara. The sponsorship - made in early 2022 - will increase the ECCDC's ability to support Niagara's early learning programs in having greater access to pedagogical materials, classroom equipment, and organizational supports through the availability of a community outreach van. The community outreach van will be utilized to deliver resources from the ECCDC's Resource Lending Library, located in Thorold, to over 170 licensed child care programs throughout the Niagara Region. The delivery service will make it easier and more affordable for child care centres to gain access to these unique materials for the thousands of children enrolled



in their programs and will reduce mileage costs for programs, while saving staff time. With less time spent trying to access and purchase materials, educators will have more time to do the most important work of setting up nurturing and supportive environments and experiences to support the children enrolled in their programs.

Kiwanis Club Sponsorship Provided Innovative Infant and Toddler Resources for Niagara's Licensed Child Care Centres

Approximately 172 licensed child care centres in Niagara received unique infant and toddler materials and complimentary training thanks to a generous contribution of more than \$20,000 from the Kiwanis Clubs of Niagara in early 2022. The infant and toddler materials are called "treasure baskets" and they provide sensory-rich play experiences for pre-verbal children and support the development of play schemas. The innovative resources will be sourced by the Early Childhood Community Development Centre, a longstanding charity offering resources, training and organizational supports to early learning programs within Niagara and across Ontario for close to 30 years. Research has shown treasure baskets provide infants and toddlers with valuable learning opportunities to support their fine motor skill development, mathematical skills, sensory development, and problem-solving skills. The rich materials also support children's innate desire to investigate and make sense of the world around them. In addition to receiving the treasure basket, Educator Teams will receive a workshop facilitated by the ECCDC's training team to explore strategies for offering meaningful experiences within early years programs.



Other Special Initiatives from April 1, 2021 to March 31, 2022

Accelerated Early Childhood Education Diploma Program

The Early Childhood Community Development Centre and Niagara College (NC) submitted an application in January 2022 through the Ministry of Labour, Immigration, Training and Skills Development to design and deliver an accelerated Early Childhood Education diploma program for educators currently employed within Niagara's early learning programs. In March 2022 confirmation was received that the proposal was accepted. The Skills Development funding will enable 100 educators currently working within licensed childcare programs and EarlyON programs to participate in a year-long program through NC, while maintaining their current employment. Upon successful completion of the program, participants will earn an Early Childhood Education diploma and the necessary credentials to become a Registered Early Childhood Educator (RECE), through the College of Early Childhood Educators. The accelerated program will be delivered over 46 weeks and will fulfill all academic requirements by giving participants credit for their previous work experiences within child care settings. Participants will start the program with credit for two field placements (levels 1 and 2), or the equivalent of 250 employment hours, and will fulfill the remaining two field placements (levels 3 and 4) at their current place of employment. Overall, participants will complete 600 employment hours, just like students in NC's current ECE programs. The program will be delivered online through asynchronous learning to provide the greatest flexibility for participants who will continue working throughout their studies. Tuition, textbooks and other program-related fees are also fully funded for participants.








