Kiwanis Club Sponsored Project Provides Niagara's Licensed Child Care Programs with Innovative Infant and Toddler Resources

Thorold: More than 170 Early Learning Programs received fully subsidized training and a treasure basket kit between April 5 2022 and June 30 2022 at the Early Childhood Community Development Centre (ECCDC). The project was coordinated by the ECCDC, in close partnership with the Kiwanis Clubs of Niagara, including: The Stamford Kiwanis Club, Welland Kiwanis Club, and St. Catharines Kiwanis Club. This project was made possible by more than \$20,000 donated by the Kiwanis Clubs of Niagara.

There were nearly 200 educators who attended a total of seven training dates offered this past spring. During the training sessions, which were offered by the ECCDC's Training Team, educators had the opportunity to learn about the theory behind treasure baskets, explore materials, as well as engage in reflective conversations with their colleagues. Participants were then provided with a treasure basket kit to take back to their programs, as well as strategies to share all the information back with their teams and with families. This project provided Niagara's early learning programs with valuable tools to support curriculum and pedagogy planning during the busy fall months and beyond.

The treasure baskets that programs received contained a variety of sensory-rich items that support pre-verbal children in multiple areas of development. These innovative resources were sourced by the Early Childhood Community Development Centre, a longstanding charity offering resources, training and organizational supports to early learning programs within Niagara Region and across Ontario for close to 30 years.

This project brought great benefits to Niagara's licensed child care programs, as research has shown that treasure baskets provide our youngest learners with valuable experiences to support the development of fine motor skills, numeracy skills, as well as help support sensory development and strengthen relationships between the child and the educator.
