

Reflective Practice Network Meeting Minutes

Monday December 8, 2014 • 6:00 to 8:00pm • ECCDC, Community Boardroom

1. Welcome and Introductions

Participants introduced themselves to the group. 2. Acceptance of the Minutes from the Last Meeting

Accepted by Shari Hill and seconded by Sharon Milne.

3. Acceptance of the Agenda

The agenda was accepted with no amendments.

4. Training/Network Development Activity

Documentation activity led by Kelly Wilcox

Kelly gave an overview and PowerPoint presentation of the 'Patio project' that Port Cares undertook. The children were invited to share their ideas through discussion and provocations (How can we make our patio beautiful?). The children were invited to communicate and share their ideas verbally, through drawings and plans using clipboards to draw their ideas. Their ideas included snakes, dinosaurs, rainbows, flowers, etc. This led into music and art activities along with toy dinosaurs and books about dinosaurs being added to the environment. Children and families brought flowers and treasures for the garden with rocks being painted and added. Acrylic paints are best for this. The children watered and tended to the garden over the spring and summer with the whole process being documented. The process honoured the children's ideas by going slowly and thoughtfully through the process and recognizing the many languages of children. The documentation made the process of learning visible and recognized how much we value children's work and the importance of advocating for children as being capable and competent. Kelly then invited participants to choose three stones: one for themselves on which they would write one word or draw an image of what they value as an educator; one for a fellow educator to write one word or draw an image of what they can give; and one for a child to write one word or draw an image of what they believe children deserve. This was followed by a discussion regarding the exercise and choosing the words.

A Thinking Lens® for Reflection and Inquiry

Participants were asked to reflect on the usefulness of A Thinking Lens® for Reflection and Inquiry and how they have utilized it in their practice. This was then followed by a whole group discussion where participants shared examples, which included interactions with staff, asked them to think a little deeper about what the children are thinking so it makes us as educators think more deeply, look at the children a little differently seeing the play and engagement in the activity, learn more from photos now because they are authentic and not posed, the documentation is showing who children are, not what they are doing, asking the children better questions, great feedback from

resource consultants to hear that children are looked at more, all children being looked at and met where they are to move forward, feeling the joy of being with the children, the stress has decreased for staff, able to reflect on what is working and what is not, respect has been taught and learned for the environment, more homey and Zen with less transitions, diminishes behaviours, strength-based approach, questions from kits have evolved to be less subjective and more openended.

The Attentiveness Protocol developed by Dr. Carol Anne Wien

Dr. Carol Anne Wien introduced us to the protocol when she came to Niagara in the spring and facilitated a Pedagogical Documentation and Studio Experience session. It helps us to value observation and documentation, to look deeply and slow down taking time to look, a tool to think and talk together about and give meaning to discussions. Participants then looked at one of Dr. Wien's photos from the Ministry of Education website, which is also in the *Think, Feel, Act* document and discussed what they saw with reference to the protocol.

5. Future Network Development

- January Meeting Revisit the Attentiveness Protocol, its usefulness and how participants have
 utilized it in their practices. Engagement of children in reflective conversation, processes people
 are going through, how staff are supported daily to have time to document and add to program
 plans, possibility of visiting sites. Participants to share information and learning from Pedagogical
 Leadership events that they have attended.
- March Meeting Higher Order Thinking Prompts. Shari offered to lead an activity regarding the
 Higher Order Thinking Prompts with some scenarios. She will also bring sample ECCDC Play Based
 Learning kits. View the Learning Environments video on the Ministry of Education website. Possibly
 travel to different centres for meeting Welland Regional Centre offered to host a meeting.
