28<sup>th</sup> Annual Niagara Early Learning & Child Care Appreciation and Recognition Gala Celebrating Community Partnerships and the Exceptional Passion and Commitment of Niagara's Early Learning Sector

Niagara Falls: The Annual Niagara Early Learning and Child Care Appreciation and Recognition Gala took place last evening at The Americana Conference Resort in Niagara Falls. During this special event, **twenty-three** early learning professionals, programs, volunteers, and students received recognition for their outstanding commitment to children and families in Niagara. Emcee Aiko Iwashita of Niagara's Dream 105.7FM supported with acknowledging the honourees at this special event, which was coordinated by the Early Childhood Community Development Centre (ECCDC), a longstanding charitable organization.
