About QCCN

Quality Child Care Niagara (QCCN) is a standardized, research-based approach designed to enhance the quality of early childhood programs. QCCN has strengthened the foundation of child care and early childhood education through high quality child care experiences, individual developmental programming and outcomes, and supports and services throughout Niagara. Quality Child Care Niagara is a mandatory component of Service Agreements with Niagara Region Children's Services.

1) Resources and Tools

2) Training

For child care programs with a purchase of service agreement with Niagara Region Children's Services, it is a requirement to have the child care educator's trained in Quality Child Care Niagara.

To facilitate all staff in being trained on an ongoing basis, the QCCN Reflective Practice Institute is currently available for educators supporting infant, toddler and preschool programs and who have not previously taken the training. The Reflective Practice Institute is available to view as five pre-recorded webinars. Connect with the QCCN Coordinator to register staff for the upcoming training session or visit the QCCN webpage.

3) Support Visits

In 2022, the new Level of Support program was implemented and this year Niagara Region Children's Services has continued to use data variables to determine each licensed child care centre's Level of Support (Level 1, 2, or 3). In January 2023, licensed child care centres received an email with a memo from Niagara Region Children's Services regarding the QCCN Level of Support for this year. ECCDC will coordinate accordingly with program's level of support.

For licensed child care centres who do not have an agreement with Niagara Region Children's Services, but have chosen to participate in QCCN:

QCCN will commit to providing:

- QCCN Reflective Practice Institute training.
- · QCCN Tool kit.
- QCCN Level of Support visits.

The Child Care Program will commit to:

- Implementation of the QCCN tools.
- Submission of monthly QCCN stats.
- Ensuring all new educators are trained in QCCN.
- Sign off on the Niagara Region Children's Services: Quality Child Care Niagara (QCCN) Terms and Agreement and Acknowledgement document.

As part of the QCCN program, centres receive a support visit to promote the use of QCCN tools and put into practice the strategies provided in training and address any concerns that may be associated with quality programming.
