The ECCDC Board is pleased to present our Community Annual Report for the year April 1, 2024 to March 31, 2025. Our Team focused on four strategic priorities during this timeframe: increasing access to quality resources; expanding professional learning opportunities; strengthening organizational support services; and evolving our ways of working to build organizational capacity and sustainability. We appreciated the feedback from our stakeholders through this year's annual survey and were pleased to receive a 92% satisfaction rating and a net promoter score of 66, indicating a high degree of loyalty. Our Team has made plans to address any suggestions for improvement over the coming year.

Our 31st year was dedicated to meeting the evolving needs of our stakeholders in new and innovative ways through offering dynamic, evidence-based professional learning opportunities, modernizing the resource lending library and educator workroom, expanding the resource delivery service, and refining mentoring supports delivered through organizational visits and Mentoring Pairs for Child Care. Our partnerships with Fort Erie Native Friendship Centre, Niagara Regional Native Centre, Métis Nation of Ontario, and a network of Francophone representatives has been greatly appreciated and has supported the development of new play-based learning materials, reflecting local culture and diverse perspectives.

During the year, we continued to support workforce stabilization and retention through coordinating Niagara's supply staff registry and partnering with Niagara College in launching Professional Advancement of Careers in Early Childhood Education (PACE). We were grateful for our continued annualized funding through Niagara Region Children's Services and for a capital grant from the Ontario Trillium Foundation to modernize the educator workroom, resource library and meeting spaces.

Over the coming year we will continue to work diligently to ensure our services have a strong and lasting impact on your work. We look forward to continuing to collaborate with many community partners dedicated to creating supportive, nurturing, quality supports and networks for the early learning sector. Thank you for the outstanding work you do each and every day on behalf of children and their families and for the privilege to serve you.

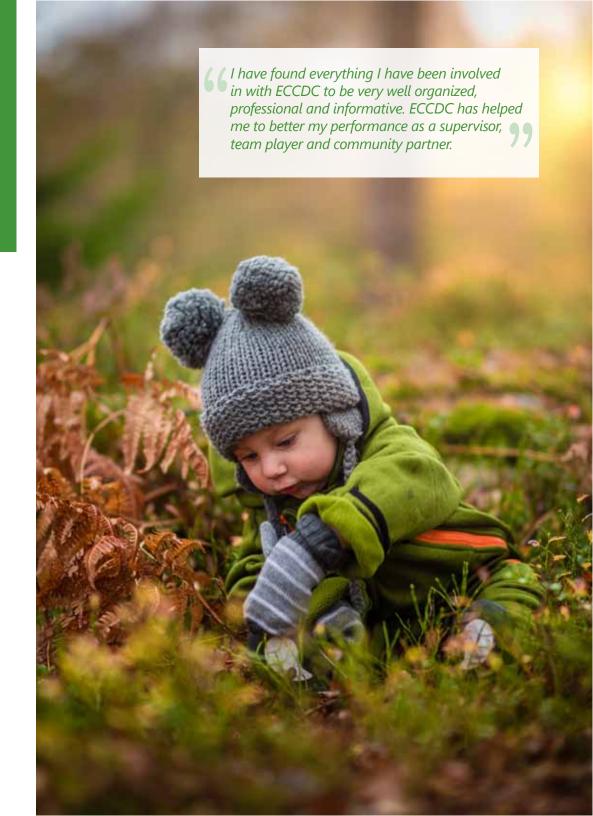

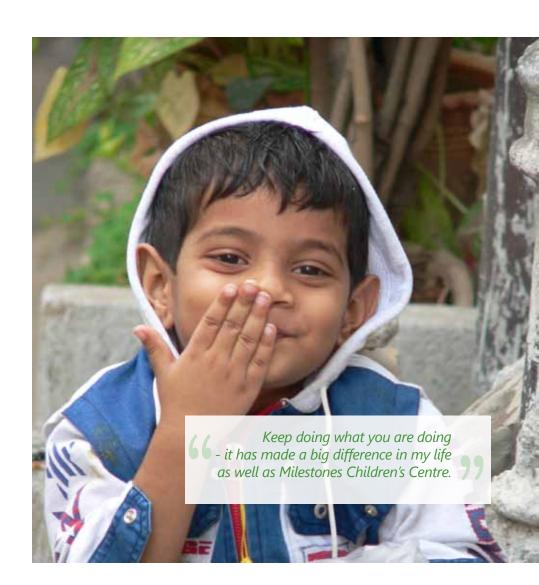

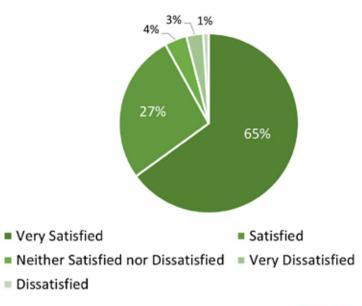
Our Community Impact

92% Satisfaction Rate

Meeting the Needs of the Early Learning and Child Care Sector

Our 2024 Stakeholder Survey results indicated an overall **92% satisfaction rate** with ECCDC Services which is considered best in class. Sixty-five percent (65%) of survey respondents indicated that they are "very satisfied" with ECCDC overall. The main drivers of this satisfaction rate were the quality of information received and helpful staff.

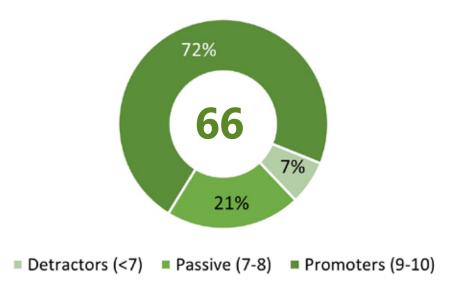
If you accessed any ECCDC services and supports over the past year, including the resource lending library, professional learning and coaching and mentoring supports, how satisfied were you?



Net Promoter Score of 66

The Net Promoter Score (NPS), indicating how likely survey respondents would be to recommend ECCDC's services and supports to other early learning and child care providers, was excellent at **66**, indicating a high degree of loyalty to ECCDC.

Service Milestones: Supporting the Resource, Professional Learning, and Organizational Needs

Resource Lending Library and Information Service Highlights

The ECCDC supports Niagara's early learning and child care sector by providing affordable access to over 5,000 pedagogical resources, play based learning kits, grab and go educational materials, and an educator workroom with tools and technologies to support curriculum planning.

Using the ECCDC's lending library assists educators in delivering meaningful experiences and designing rich environments that inspire children. We also offer a delivery service to bring resources directly to programs if access is a barrier, and an estore for those looking to purchase materials. Onsite facilities include a specialized workroom, learning café for informal gatherings, two small meeting rooms and a large conference room.

Throughout 2024/25 we focused on diversifying the resource library collection of pedagogical resources, identifying new technology and tools to foster lending library borrowing experiences, and investigated new and innovative ways to increase educators' accessibility to resources.

Resource Lending Library and Information Service Highlights

2276 Educators, Administrators, and Community Support Workers had access to resources, pedagogical supports, and technical workroom and meeting spaces through Library membership.

Visits were made by educators dropping into the resource lending library or were made directly to child care programs delivering resource materials (100 visits/month on average).

Licensed Child Care Centres, EarlyON Programs, Kindergarten Programs, and Community Programs had access to resource library membership and meeting facilities.

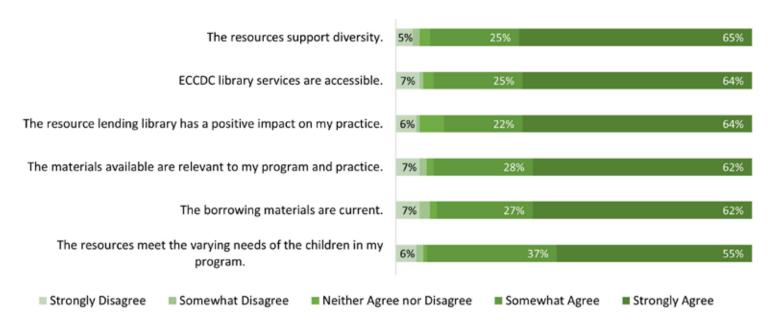
Curriculum and pedagogy resources were borrowed or purchased (280 resources were borrowed/month on average).

Hours were made available for resource borrowing, staff collaborative curriculum planning and networking (61.5 hours/week on average).

New learning kits were designed for borrowing or purchasing (13 new kits were designed/month on average).

In our 2024-25 Stakeholder Survey 87% of survey respondents agreed that the library has a positive impact on their practice. 89% reported that our library services were accessible

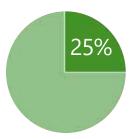
Thinking about the resource library and information services you have accessed during the period of April 2024 to March 2025, please indicate your level of agreement with the following:



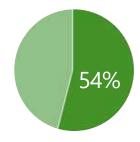

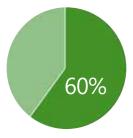

Professional Learning and Special Events

ECCDC professional learning opportunities are designed to support emerging trends in the early learning and child care sector, prompt reflective thinking, deepen understanding of children's learning, and provide discussion around practical strategies. We believe that reflective practice and mentoring relationships are important facets to learning and growing as educators.

Throughout 2024/25 we focused on offering diverse, affordable, and accessible professional learning while remaining flexible to support ongoing transformation in the sector and establishing new partnerships and ways to leverage local expertise as well as investigating ways to measure the ongoing impact of training.

Advertised community-wide training sessions were offered in person or virtually with **4,974** educators and administrators in attendance (10/month on average).

136

Customized professional learning and training sessions were offered in person or virtually to community early learning agencies upon request with **2509** educators and administrators in attendance (12/month on average).

293

Educators and administrators were supported through **28** community of practice network sessions held virtually.

In our 2024-25 stakeholder survey, 86% agreed that the learning opportunities had a positive impact on their practice. 89% of respondents agreed that ECCDC professional learning opportunities were of high quality

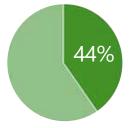

Coaching and Mentoring Services

Our Team works alongside educators and leaders in designing developmentally appropriate, play-based experiences and learning environments that engage children in active, creative, and meaningful inquiry-based learning.

Through engaging in dialogue and reflective practice, goals for children's development and well-being and suggestions for developing authentic relationships with children, families, and each other are explored. High quality learning spaces inspire staff, welcome families, and are associated with positive outcomes for children.

During this timeframe we focused on mentoring promising practices to support agencies in achieving their goals, leveraging past programs, tools and initiatives to support organizational growth and designing tools to measure the impact of our organizational support services.

Connections were made with programs offering organizational supports through **345** visits. Educators and administrators were supported for curriculum planning, team building, playground naturalization, board development, or technical needs.

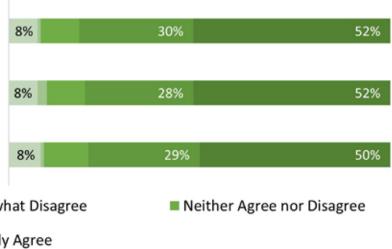

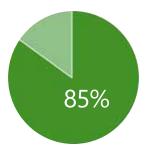

Mentoring Pairs for Child Care

The ECCDC first launched Mentoring Pairs for Child Care (MPCC) in 2009 to enhance child care quality by matching more experienced child care supervisors with supervisors new to their role. The goal of the program was to enhance the quality of care by expanding supervisor knowledge and understanding through group learning, guided communication, site visits, and one-to-one interaction. Opportunities were offered for supervisors to deepen their capacity for excellence in child care administration. In 2024 a revitalized, year-long



hybrid program was launched, leveraging the past MPCC process and framework inspiring longstanding supervisors to mentor their newer colleagues to help support the development of emerging leadership skills.

"When I first heard about this program, I was excited at the prospect of meeting fellow supervisors who could help me grow and learn in my role as a Supervisor. Each month, the topics were relevant and thought-provoking. I liked the way the sessions were structured with lots of leading questions that kept me reflecting on my own day-to-day practices.
