The Quality Child Care Niagara Approach

Who We Are

Quality Child Care Niagara (QCCN) is the Quality Initiative Program for Niagara's licensed child care sector. QCCN was established in 1999 with two main goals: to strengthen early identification for early referrals of all children; and to support high quality early development opportunities for children enrolled in licensed child care. QCCN is funded through Niagara Region Children's Services. The Early Childhood Community Development Centre (ECCDC) coordinates the initiative on behalf of Niagara Region through offering training, QCCN tools, and support visits. ECCDC works alongside QCCN partners Pathstone Mental Health and Niagara Children's Centre and receives ongoing advisement from Niagara Region Children's Services and the Quality Child Care Advisory Committee.

Our Vision

A consistent approach to excellence in early learning for children and families through the commitment of highly knowledgeable and responsive educators.

Our Statement

A strength-based, reciprocal partnership supporting children and professionals through a continuum of collaboration, training, and the use of developmental tools.



"The Brigance Readiness Binder, QCCN Developmental Reference Charts, and the Developmental Profiles Textbook are beneficial planning and developmental resources help to support us in the early learning environment by allowing a clear pathway regarding all individualized needs in our program. Support Visits, Tools, and Resources

Beginning in 2022, a new service model called the Level of Support was implemented as a method to prioritize QCCN Support Visits by allocating more time with programs that require additional supports, whereas previously all programs received an annual QCCN Support Visit once a year. To reflect this year's Level of Support for each centre, Niagara Region Children's Services issued a questionnaire in which the collected data determined the individual centre's Level of Support to either 1, 2, or 3. Based on a centre's Level of Support, the QCCN Support Visits were customized to support the needs of each centre through an asset-based approach.

Additionally, as of September 2023 Niagara Region Children's Services updated the policy for Short Term Specialized Support Funding which included QCCN visiting centres that were in receipt of Short Term Specialized Support Funding during their first seven weeks to complete ECCDC's Program Inclusion Reflection Tool with the centre. Following the seven-week point, Niagara Region Children's Services staff met with the centre to review the completed Program Inclusion Reflection Tool along with additional requirements from the centre.

- 125 Support Visits with 50 centres were completed
- 600 educators were consulted during the Support Visits

Centres continued to implement the mandatory DPS and Speech and Language Pathology Referral Checklist for each child which were recorded in the monthly QCCN Statistical Reporting. The Behaviour C.A.R.E. Checklist, Environmental Rating Scales, Caregiver Interaction Scales, and the Program Profile have been utilized as needed basis. QCCN Resources; such as, Brigance Readiness Binder, Developmental Profiles Textbook, Family Engagement Strategies, and QCCN Developmental Reference Charts were also used by centres to support their ongoing quality journey.



Reflective Practice Institute Training

We continued to offer the QCCN Reflective Practice Institute Training through five (5) on-demand Webinar Modules to licensed child care centres, EarlyON centres, Niagara College Early Childhood Education program students, and Niagara College Six Nations Polytechnic Early Childhood Education program students. Each of the webinar modules were revised from the previous year to reflect the most up-to-date information along with the addition of auto-closed captioning to support various learning styles.



Licensed Child Care Centres in Niagara

Educators supporting infants, toddlers, and/or preschool programs who previously *did not complete* the full **Quality Child Care Niagara Reflective Practice Institute** had registered to participate in the **five (5) Webinar Modules** that were offered in **two (2) rotations** throughout 2023. Each rotation was available over a three-month period, and educators were able to complete the training at their own pace and schedule.

In addition to the five (5) Webinar Modules, educators that have *completed* the QCCN Reflective Practice Institute Training in the past (between November 20215 to August 2023) and currently supporting infant, toddler, and/or preschool programs in Niagara are required to complete the *mandatory* new **QCCN Speech and Language Training** to ensure the community continues to receive consistent QCCN training to support their work. This **1-hour pre-recorded Webinar Module** training includes the new Niagara Children's Centre's Online Referral Portal, updated Checklists, Referral Process, and documents. Centres are welcome to complete the QCCN Speech and Language Training as a team during their staff meeting or educators can complete it at their own pace and schedule.







Length of time in the child care field





EarlyON Centres in Niagara

Educators from EarlyON centres that are part of Quality Child Care Niagara who previously did not participate in the **three (3) Webinar Modules**; DISC Preschool Screen (DPS), Speech and Language Referral Checklist, and Behaviour C.A.R.E. Checklist, were offered a catch-up QCCN training session from **October to December 2023**.

- 7 educators completed the three-webinar module QCCN Training
- 100% of educators indicated the QCCN Tools and Resources to be impactful to their current practice
- 100% reported being confident in completing the Speech and Language Pathology Referral Checklist and Behaviour C.A.R.E Checklist
- 66% reported being **confident** in completing the **DPS** and some educators received **in-person support** following the training to gain higher level of confidence in DPS



Niagara College

This year we had the opportunity to offer the QCCN Reflective Practice Institute Training to three (3) Niagara College student groups; Niagara College Accelerated Early Childhood Education program students (January to February 2023), Niagara College Early Childhood Education program students (October to December 2023) and Niagara College Six Nations Polytechnic Indigenous Early Childhood Education program students (October to December 2023). Each student received the same training as educators in licensed child care centres to ensure consistency as the students enter into the early learning and child care field.

- 77 students completed the QCCN Reflective Practice Institute Training
- 94% of the students indicated they have gained a greater understanding of the QCCN Tools and Resources
- 95% have attained new knowledge following the training
- 96% of the students reported the QCCN Tools and Resources to be impactful to their current and future practice
